Following the signature of the RFID PIA Framework in Brussels on April 6th, 2011, industry associations in various member states have started to hold extensive consultations, on line and via seminars and workshops, in order to clarify the ways in which the Framework can be best implemented at the national level. These consultations have been generally supported by Member State Governments, e.g. the German Ministry of Economics and Technology and the French Ministry of the Economy, Industry and Employment. This panel will discuss the most common challenges facing RFID Application Providers at each stage in the implementation of the process phases of a privacy impact assessment (preliminary considerations, initial analysis, privacy risk assessment) and the answers proposed by industry associations and/or individual companies for applying the Framework in an efficient and effective way.

Moderator: Nicolas DUBOIS, European Commission (DG JUST)

Clause 19 of the RFID Recommendation stipulates that "Member States should inform the Commission at the latest 24 months following the publication of this Recommendation in the Official Journal of the European Union of action taken in response to this Recommendation." This panel will bring together experts from the public sector to discuss the future of the RFID Recommendation, with special emphasis

placed on PIAs: Should there be a greater reliance on self-regulation to implement the RFID-specific provisions of the Data Protection and ePrivacy Directives and to achieve their objectives? Should a minimum of government involvement be required for the implementation of the obligations included in the Directives (i.e. co-regulation which, in its minimal form, gives a legal link between self-regulation and the national legislator in accordance with the legal traditions of the different Member States)? Should some aspects of the Recommendation be subject to the imposition of stronger regulatory obligations? What is the role that European Commission's standardisation mandates requested to the three European Standardisation Organisations can play in achieving the objectives of the Recommendation?
